The Bachelor of Arts degree in Sociology encompasses core requirements in social theory, research methods, and human diversity. The major offers options in Sociology or in Social Services.

The Sociology Option is designed for students with career interests in the public sector or business or entry into law school, public administration, or graduate work in Sociology. Sociology option students must take 3 of 5 courses in the area of social diversity. Any upper division sociology courses may be used to complete the additional 28 units required.

The Social Services Option is designed to prepare students for beginning practice in a social services agency or going on to graduate study in social work. In the Social Services Option, students take a variety of courses including one quarter of field placement in a social services agency.

SCHEDULING

The Sociology major is an evening and Saturday program. Courses are scheduled to allow a student to complete the upper division portion of the program in a two year period. Some day courses are also scheduled and may be taken to supplement the evening program.

APPLICATION

The Concord Campus operates on the quarter system with four quarters a year. Applications are accepted every quarter. Applicants who want to enroll at the Concord Campus must be eligible for admission as an upper division student. Upper division and graduate courses only are offered at the Concord Campus.
